The funeral service for Leroy (Johnnie) Diamond, 76, of Lufkin will be held at 2:30 p.m., Friday, May 14, 2021, in the Colonial Mortuary Chapel. Burial will follow in the Davis Memorial Garden. Mr. Diamond was born May 11, 1944, in Lufkin, and died on Friday, May 7, 2021, in Lufkin.

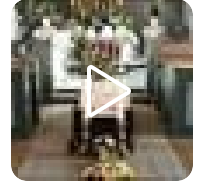
